easy-peasy - something that is a piece of cake

łatwiutki

be zonked out - to be extremely tired

This week has been pretty intensive and I'm zonked out.

potwornie zmęczony

pig out - to eat too much

No wonder you're fat if you tend to pig out everytime you see food.

obżerać się

shoot the breeze - to talk about irrelevant things

That was a great night because we shot the breeze and literally forgot about work.

gadać o niczym

You're such a wimp - to say that someone is weak and cowardly

Are you afraid of dogs? You're such a wimp.
